What We're Learning This Week!



<u>Literacy</u>

This week we have been talking and writing about our holidays and discussed all the places they might have gone to visit.

Next week -We will be looking at the story of "The Little Red Hen" using story map to re-tell and discuss about each event and begin to sequence the story.

<u>Homework</u> - Look at "The Little Red Hen" story map and talk to your child what happens at the beginning, middle and end of the story.

<u>Phonics</u>

This week we have been consolidating work on Phase 4 and 5 of the phonics: ay as in play, oy as in boy, ie as in pie, ea as in leaf. In addition, we have looked at the tricky word "could".

Next week- we will continue to consolidate all the sounds from phase 4 and 5 such as: a-e as in snake, ay as in day, ai as in rain.

<u>Homework</u> - Children should now be writing sentences independently using their knowledge of Phase 2/3/4/5 supported by tricky words. Challenge your child to write about weekend news.

<u>Maths</u>

This week- we have been learning about positional language. For instance, 'in', 'under', and 'over', or the phrases 'on top of', or 'next to'. An example of a sentence containing positional words would be 'The puppet is on the castle.

'Key words: in, under, over, on top, next to, in front, behind.

Next week- Our topic for next week is 'Length'. Children will be learning that there are two ways of ordering length, ascending and descending. Please talk to children about what ascending and descending is.

Explain the longer the object is the bigger the number is, the shorter the object the smaller the number

Key words: Short, shorter, shortest, length, small, big, long, longest, longer <u>Homework-</u> Please encourage them to look at the objects, use the key vocabulary and use the word in a sentence. E.g. Which is the longest twig?
