## What We're Learning This Week!



### Literacy

This week: we have been retelling the story of 'The Little Red Hen'.

**Next week:** We will be writing about our favourite part of the story using a range of conjunctions such as: because, and, so, but, or.

<u>Homework</u> - Continue to look at "The Little Red Hen" story map and work on retelling and sequencing the story with your child.

#### **Phonics**

This week: we have been consolidating work on Phase 4 and 5 of the phonics: a-e for cake, ai for vain, ay for pay. We have also looked at the tricky word 'should'.

## <u>Maths</u>

This week- we have been learning about length and height. We had lots of fun ordering each other from tallest to shortest as a whole class!

'Key words: short, shorter, shortest, long, longer, longest, tall, taller, tallest.

Next week- Our topic for next week is 'weight'. Children will be learning how to estimate the weight of items by becoming human weighing scales! We will also be comparing weight. For example, 'the apple weighs more than the paper clip because it is heavier'.

Key words: Heavy, heavier, heaviest, light, lighter, lightest.

<u>Homework-</u> Please gather a range of household items and ask your child to estimate which one is the heaviest and which one is the lightest.
