



Reading

- Little and often e.g. books, labels, signs
- Ask comprehension questions –
 e.g. why, what who, when, which,
- Let your child make predictions
- Talk about new words
- Review the book/story
- Write a comment in the reading record book
- Library book is taken home once a week on a Friday.

- Ensure that your child has his/her book bag daily
- Encourage changing the reading book on the book changing days i.e. Monday and Thursday.
- Teaching of reading is also done through shared, guided reading and phonics.
- Children's book levels may change based on both their comprehension and sight reading skills.

This will be a homework program for your children to do independently 10 minutes daily.

The /dʒ/ sound spelt as dge, for example in the word 'badge'.



Press the sound button to hear the sound.

To make this sound at the *end* of a word with a short vowel sound we can use the letters 'dge'.

For example:

The wolf ran to Granny's house and locked Granny in the wardrobe. He put on her nightgown and got into her bed.


When Little Red Riding Hood came to the house, she said, "Oh Granny, what big ears you have."

Count in multiples of 3 from 0, forwards and backwards

To count in 3s we keep adding on 3.



Log ins are the same as in Year1.

Spellings

- Spelling test is on Thursday of each week
- All spelling tests are recorded in individual spelling books
- Results recorded in reading record books
- Encourage the Look, Say, Cover, Write, Check method when practising at home.

- Expectations are that the children will practise their spellings and know what they mean.
- NN: Common exception words for Year I and Year 2.
- High frequency words for Year I and 2.

- Once every half term
- Related to topics e.g. Healthy Choices,
 Florence Nightingale.
- Several weeks to complete. The due date is always provided with the written outline of the task.
- Use a range of resources. Please don't rely solely on computerised work. We are encouraging children to develop their written and designing skills.
- Drawings/ Photos/ Models

Weekly

- Weekly homework is sent out on a Friday and due in the following Thursday to be marked.
- The children that do not bring back their H/W will not be rewarded with golden time.
- Please support the school by ensuring that your child does all the homework set and returns it by the recommended date.
- Particularly ensure that reading is done regularly at home.
