# Times

Year 1 morning doors open **8.45am**

# Reading

- Reading - Please listen to your child read everyday and write a comment in their reading logs.
- Reading books are changed on a Monday and Thursday.
- Children's book levels may change based on both their comprehension and sight reading skills.
- Ask comprehension questions - e.g. why, what who, when, which, make predictions
- Talk about new words
- Review the book/story
- Ensure that your child has his/her book bag daily
- Teaching of reading is also done through shared, guided reading and phonics.
- Bug Club logins can be found in your yellow reading record books.

Doodle is a creative learning tool that covers the core areas of Maths and English.

It is a personalised learning experience tailored to the needs of every child - improving their confidence and ability.

**This will be a homework program for your children to do independently 10 minutes daily.**



The /dʒ/ sound spelt as dge, for example in the word 'badge'.



Press the sound button to hear the sound.

To make this sound at the end of a word with a short vowel sound we can use the letters 'dge'.

For example:

badge edge bridge

"I'm going to visit my grandmother," she said.

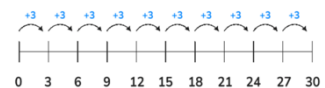
The wolf ran to Granny's house and locked Granny in the wardrobe. He put on her nightgown and got into her bed.

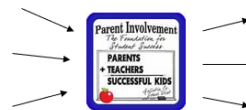
